We can also add adults with physical needs or Alzheimer's.

Attached is a form that we would like for parents or guardians to fill out and return to us with a photo attached. Once this information is returned to the Sheriff's Office, your child or family member will be added to the system, should an emergency arise, dispatchers will have all of the important information to give to the officers responding.
