ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL REPORT: Mr. Trent Whaley

- **Pre-K** Enrollment is looking great. To date we currently have 18 students enrolled. This speaks to the talent of Mrs. Kessens and Mrs. Marley.
- Kindergarten Registration is scheduled for March 10, 2022 from 1 pm to 6 pm.
- 1st Grade Classes continue to have a family member come in each week to read aloud to all of
 first grade. The students love this program. Mrs. Kreutzjans has welcomed me into her class
 each week to read a story that a student selects. Mr. Whaley applauded Mrs. Kreutzjans for her
 dedication to literacy.
- 2nd Grade Mrs. Borgman's class began a fundraiser to sell snacks for one week. They raised \$218.60 for Safe Passage (Endless Possibilities) program. The students came up with this idea and worked on their money counting skills throughout the whole process.
- **3rd Grade** Teachers have been working hard to prepare students for the IREAD-3 test that is coming up in March.
- **4th Grade** Deputy Dan presented a Civil War lesson to the whole 4th grade. He focused on Morgan's Raid which is Indiana history.
- 5th Grade Mrs. Hoff's class welcomed JCD students from the high school to present on hygiene. The career center students talked about topics like germs that are spread on hands and proper care of teeth.
- **6th Grade** Mrs. Horn's class has explored South America through research and created flags for the 13 countries.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

- Within the next month bus related issues will be revisited.

- Trane came through and completed the bidding process on the HVAC. All of this financing is coming through ESSR funds and is no cost to the corporation as was the school sign and other projects.
